## Resolution TC 19-105 – Resolution Creating Redevelopment Steering Committee; Appoint Members to Redevelopment Steering Committee

**WHEREAS**, on November 19, 2018, the Township Committee of the Township of Harding ("**Committee**") directed the Planning Board of the Township of Harding ("**Planning Board**"), by way of TC Resolution 18-196, to conduct an investigation to determine whether certain properties within the Township of Harding ("**Township**") are in need of redevelopment according to the statutory criteria set forth in the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-1, *et seq.* (the "**Redevelopment Law**"); and

**WHEREAS**, the properties identified for investigation were Lot 2 in Block 27 and Lot 1 in Block 34 as shown on the official tax maps of the Township (the "**Study Area**"), located on Mount Kemble Avenue (Route 202) and totally 29.44 acres; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning Board retained the planning firm of Heyer, Gruel & Associates ("**Heyer**") to perform the investigation of the Study Area; and

**WHEREAS**, following its investigation, Heyer prepared a report entitled "Area in Need of Redevelopment Investigation Report, 685 Mt. Kemble Avenue ("Glen Alpin"), 679 Mt. Kemble Avenue ("Hurstmont")", dated February 1, 2019, wherein Heyer concludes that the Study Area meets the statutory criteria of the Redevelopment Law as an area in need of redevelopment (the "**Report**"); and

**WHEREAS**, on February 19, 2019, following a public hearing, the Planning Board voted to recommend to the Committee the designation of the Study Area as an area in need of redevelopment; and

**WHEREAS**, on February 25, 2019, through TC Resolution 19-073, the Township Committee designated the Study Area as an area in need of redevelopment (hereinafter, the Study Area shall be referred to as the "**Redevelopment Area**"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee has determined that it is in the best interests of the Township to establish a Redevelopment Steering Committee, to be comprised of elected officials, Planning Board members, and citizens, to provide guidance to the Committee and facilitate the preparation of a Redevelopment Plan for the Redevelopment Area by Heyer.
