WHEREAS, Lieutenant Gromek is a Defensive Tactics Instructor, a graduate of the FBI-LEEDA Supervisor, Command and Executive Leadership Institute, graduate of FBI LEEDA Media and Public Relations Academy, graduate of Penn State University Field Training Officer Program, graduate of Stockton University Internal Affairs Investigator Program, a court recognized Drug Recognition Expert, eleven (11) time recipient of Mothers Against Drunk Driving Award, one (1) exceptional duty award, one (1) honorable service award, and two (2) lifesaving awards; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Gromek received a Bachelor of Arts Degree from Kean University; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Gromek received a Master's Degree from Seton Hall University; and

# Resolution TC 23-088 -- Resolution to Authorize a Tonnage Grant Application

WHEREAS, the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act, P.L. 1987, c. 102, has established a recycling fund from which a tonnage grant may be made to municipalities in order to encourage local source separation and recycling programs; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent and the spirit of the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act to use the tonnage grants to develop new municipal recycling programs and to continue and to expand the existing program; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection has promulgated recycling regulations to implement the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act; and

WHEREAS; the recycling regulations impose on the municipalities certain requirements as a condition for applying for tonnage grants, including but not limited to, making and keeping accurate verifiable records of materials collected and claimed by the municipality; and

WHEREAS, a resolution authorizing this municipality to apply for the 2023 recycling grant will memorialize the commitment of this municipality to recycling and to indicate the assent of the Harding Township Committee to the efforts undertaken by the municipality and the requirements contained in the Recycling Act and recycling regulations; and

WHEREAS, such a resolution should designate the individual authorized to ensure the application is properly completed and timely filed.

**BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Harding Township Committee that:

- 1. Harding Township hereby endorses the submission of the recycling tonnage grant application to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and designates Tracy Toribio to ensure that the application is properly filed.
- 2. The monies received from the recycling tonnage grant will be deposited in a dedicated recycling trust fund to be used solely for the purposes of recycling.
- 3. This resolution replaces resolution TC 22-088 which was approved on March 14, 2022.

#### Resolution TC 23-091 - Resolution to Authorize the Execution of the Verizon Consent Order

WHEREAS, on July 13, 2022, Plaintiff New York SMSA Limited Partnership (aka "Verizon") filed a Complaint in the United States District Court, District of New Jersey, bearing Docket No. 2:22-CV-

04531-JMV-MAH against Defendants the Township of Harding ("Township"), New Jersey, and Zoning Board of Adjustment of the Township of Harding (the "Zoning Board"), New Jersey (the "Lawsuit"); and

WHEREAS, the Township issued a public bid, in accordance with New Jersey's Local Lands and Buildings Law, codified at N.J.S.A. 40A-12.1, et seq., for lease rights to construct a wireless communications facility "not to exceed 140 feet above ground" level at the Subject Property in November 2016, and Plaintiff was the successful bidder and in furtherance of same, the Township and Plaintiff entered into a Land Lease Agreement dated June 14, 2018 (the "Land Lease Agreement"), that was contingent upon Plaintiff, as Lessee, obtaining all required governmental approvals including but not limited to site plan and use variance approval from the Board of Adjustment; and

WHEREAS, Plaintiff originally proposed that the Facility include a monopole designed to resemble a tree at a height of 140 feet, extending to a height of 146 feet to include stealth branching, as well as related equipment located at the base of the monopole; and

WHEREAS, the Consent Order is contingent upon the Board of Adjustment's review and approval of the Consent Order at a duly noticed Whispering Woods hearing. See Whispering Woods at Bamm Hollow, Inc. v. Township of Middletown Planning Board, et al., 220 N.J.Super. 161, 170-72 (1987); and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Adjustment has agreed to the terms of this Consent Order and entered the same --subject to said Whispering Woods Hearing and thus, in accordance with the Board, the Township agrees to the terms of the Consent Order; and

**WHEREAS**, the Parties desire to resolve and settle any and all claims relating to the Lawsuit to avoid the additional expense and uncertainties of continued litigation and have agreed to resolve all claims amongst the Parties.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Harding (the "Committee") that subject to the following conditions:

1. The Township Committee hereby authorizes and directs Township Counsel, or his/her designee to execute the Consent Order attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, subject to any minor revisions from Counsel.
